## 'FINALLY GOT THE BREAKS'

NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—The lucky break for Notre Dame in its closing game of the season with Army at the Yankee Stadium today came when Wayne Millner, our sophomore end, blocked and recovered an Army punt for the winning touchdown.

We won on luck, as well as fight. Army has a really great team and a fighting team. But the breaks always ride with the winner, sometimes—as they did today—making the winner.

Army had a slight edge on breaks early in the game, recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass which led to touchdowns. I thought then that we were in for just another uncomfortable afternoon. But the law of averages saved us. We finally got our share, and a lot that we had missed all through the season.

### LUKATS BIG STAR

With one exception, the Notre Dame line played without replacements. I used both Wunsch and Pivarnik at right guard because both are seniors and it was their last game.

Capt. Hugh Devore, Kitty Gorman and Wayne Millner were outstanding in our line, although everyone played splendid ball.

In the backfield, Nick Lukats proved himself again to be a fine competitor. This was the first time he was called upon to punt all season and he kicked like a veteran, averaging about 40 yards and dropping several punts dead inside of the Army 10-yard line.

Fred Carideo, the junior full-back from Mt. Vernon, N. Y., also deserves a lot of praise for his fine work. He was r'arin' to go, because I haven't had a chance to use him all season. When big Don Elser was hurt last week, I had to use Fred. Instead of going all to pieces in our biggest game before the biggest crowd to see us play this year, he performed like a true veteran.

### SORRY FOR ARMY

The game was cleanly played on both sides and Army showed why it has had such a great record by capitalizing immediately on the two breaks we sent its way.

We are genuinely sorry if we have deprived Army of a bid to the Rose Bowl game, for we always have enjoyed our relationship with the Cadets, but it certainly feels good to have this game to look back on. I am especially glad for the sake of our seniors who displayed a wonderful spirit all season and never got discouraged in defeat, but came back stronger every week.

This game will be an incentive to our sophomores next year.
