

La Salle Climbs Notch, St. James 3d

All but one of the top 20 teams in The Inquirer's Delaware Valley high school football ratings were victorious last week.

Previously 14th-ranked Bishop Egan was beaten by third-ranked La Salle, 33-6, to drop out of the top 20 while La Salle took over the No. 2 spot, replacing St. James (now No. 3).

Bishop Egan's position was filled by Nether Providence after it extended its undefeated string to 23 games by trouncing Haverford, 38-8.

Pennsbury, The Inquirer's top-ranked team, scored a 23-12 victory over Allentown High and fourth-ranked Monsignor Bonner stopped Salesianum, 38-6.

Although sixth-ranked Upper Merion technically has two losses because of forfeitures during the teachers' strike, it won its conference opener over Cheltenham in convincing style, 61-14.

Central Bucks West and Ridley were both victorious while West Catholic was not scheduled.
