

# Malvern Rips St. Joe's;

Interacademic League champion Malvern Prep, powered by the running and passing of quarterback Steve Donnelly, handed Catholic South champion St. Joseph's Prep a 37-16 loss yesterday.

Donnelly threw a 35-yard scoring pass to Joe Carney in the first quarter, and after the Prep drew even in the next period, Donnelly bulled over from the eight for a 16-8 lead.

Donnelly, who completed seven of 13 passes for 154 of his club's 362 yards, raced 42 yards to score in the third period. Steve Scheurle and Pierce Keating each ran for 50-yard TDs later, sealing the decision.

Grey McIlvain ran for one St. Joe score and threw 40 yards to John Dugan for another.

Malvern completed its season with a 9-0-1 mark.

All-Catholic end Gerry Smith caught his 10th touchdown pass of the season, helping Bishop Neumann de-

feat Southern 24-6, at 12th and Bigler Streets.

Neumann, which has won 23 of the last 26 meetings, raised its advantage over Southern to 24-14-3 in the series which began in 1934.

Smith, who finished with 45 receptions for 835 yards, shared the spotlight with game MVP Al Barbieri. The Neumann halfback opened the game with an 85-yard kickoff return to Southern's three-yard line and later threw a 20-yard option pass to Smith for six points.

**MARTIN LUTHER KING 33, OVERBROOK 0** — Tom Murphy, a 5-9 quarterback, tossed a pair of scoring passes, including a 65-yarder to Brad Norris as King scored in each quarter at Overbrook.

Murphy, who also intercepted a pass, completed throws good for 158 yards.

**ROMAN CATHOLIC 30, ROXBOROUGH 14** — Joe DiWilliams picked off three Roxborough passes as Roman took a 3-1 lead in the holiday rivalry before more than 4,500 spectators at Pechin and Hermitage sts.

Roman capitalized on a powerful ground attack, as Clifton Riley and Rich Gardner combined for 277 yards.

Kevin McDougall threw scoring bombs of 55 and 37 yards for Roxboro, which finished the season 0-10.

**EASTON 7, PHILLIPSBURG 0** — Joe Hepp of Easton was named the most valuable back as he ended his season with 1,020 yards and led Easton to its second consecutive win in a series that resumed for the 69th time yesterday.
