Episcopal takes a 42-7 beating from Malvern Prep's backfield

The Friars' Booker, Nangle and Borgerson did most of the damage.

MELROSE — Episcopal Academy figured to be in for a tough afternoon Friday against Malvern Prep's top running backs, Derrick Downs and Toby Booker, who each average more than 6 yards a carry.
The Churchmen were right, but Malvern proved that it isn't drawn by just a two-horse carriage.
The Friars thrashed Episcopal, 42-7, using solid running games by all four members of its backfield, from halfbacks Downs and Booker to fullback Joe Nangle and even quarterback Doug Borgerson.
While Booker led the Friars with 109 yards on eight carries that included a 65-yard touchdown, and Downs carried the ball only four times for 21 yards, it was Nangle and Borgerson who came up with the

biggest plays in the Inter-Ac League football game.
Nangle racked up 100 yards on just four carries and had scoring runs of 72 and 17 yards. Borgerson had 85 yards on three carries with touchdown runs of 71 and 6 yards.
"It's not just Booker and Downs," said Episcopal coach Roger White, whose team is 34 overall, 62 in the league. "All of their backs are great."
Malvern improved to 30 in the Inter-Ac, strengthening its chance for a second straight league title. Overall the Friars are 7-0.
"Once they start to roll with the ball, it's kind of awesome," said Priars coach Gump Peligrini, who seemed in awe himself of his team's 31-yard rushing performance.
Get the backs some running room, and they're going to go. Downs, Booker, Nangle or Borgerson, you can get beat by any one of them. I've never had a team this good, and they just explode on you.
Malvern's offense got some help from the defense early on. With 5 minutes, 58 seconds remaining in the

first quarter, linebacker Steve Galczinski picked up a pitch that went astray from Episcopal quarterback Brian Person and stroled 3 yards for a touchdown.
In the second quarter, the Friars scored on all three of their possessions to push their lead to 28-0. In the third quarter, they extended it to 42-0, scoring on their first two series.
"Our goal as seniors is to win the Inter-Ac and go out the whole season undefeated," Nangle said. "Right now, we just want to keep things going."
Episcopal, which was held to 106 total yards, got its score in the fourth quarter when Matt Bailer picked up a fumble and rumbled 71 yards.
