On Saturday, Quinn was a double-edged sword as visiting Malvern pasted Germantown Academy, 44-7, to complete a 4-0 Inter-Ac League season and give coach Gapare "Gamp" Pellegrini his 16th title (18 outright, three shared) in 24 seasons.

The Friars frolicked on offense, generating 358 yards on 43 plays as Michael Treston (15 carries, 136 yards, two touchdowns) led the way. The defense yielded
