

# Malvern Prep captures Inter-Ac title with 32-0 romp over Episcopal

With Chris Downs leading the way, the Friars gave coach Gamp Pellegrini his 13th title in 20 years.

MERION — Chris Downs helped bring Malvern Prep coach Gamp Pellegrini his 13th Inter-Academic League championship in the last 20 years.

And Downs may also have set up Pellegrini, if he doesn't retire, for a couple more titles by helping to lure sophomore lineman Clarence Green to the school.

Downs was his usual spectacular self in the league finale against Episcopal Academy (1-8, 0-3), rushing for 212 yards on 29 carries to lead the Friars (8-1, 4-0) to a 32-0 victory.

The league's all-time career rusher also scored the game's first four touchdowns.

Green hasn't made the headlines this season but if this 5-foot-9, 265-pound package of muscle and emotion keeps improving, he should some day.

He conceded he had "a lot of fun" creating havoc in the Churchmen's offensive backfield as he continually broke through blocks at his defensive tackle position.

And what could be more fun for an offensive tackle than blocking for the speedy Downs, who needs

only the barest of line cracks to jump-start his blazing downfield runs.

"A lot of sophomores, juniors and seniors stepped up this year," Green said. "Our captains were better this year. And we got aggressive. We came out and threw a punch, and kept throwing them."

Green originally was at West Philadelphia High, but transferred after the Downs family sold him on the benefits of the Malvern program.

He had to sit out last season's Inter-Ac games because of the league's transfer rules.

"I don't live too far from Chris, so I see him on a daily basis," Green said. "And Mrs. Downs is a real nice woman. I really owe all my success to her, my parents and my family. She really was the one who got me out here."

The question now is whether Pellegrini will retire after 20 years and all those titles.

As in past seasons, he hedged. But he admitted it was getting tougher and tougher to get through the league seasons.

"I think about [retiring] a lot," the head coach said.

"My coaches know I'm getting a little frizzled. I haven't decided not

to come back. It's just that when you're winning, it should be easier," he said.

"But it's not. It's harder. You've got to defend yourself every week. Every week is a big ball game, there's no rest."

"And when you come to games like this, when you're such a heavy favorite, it really destroys you. It beats the heck out of me."

And it also doesn't help when your senior fullback breaks his leg right in front of you midway through the second quarter.

Dan Bonner was a good soldier in Malvern's wing-T sets, and did a lot of the dirty work for Downs' glory.

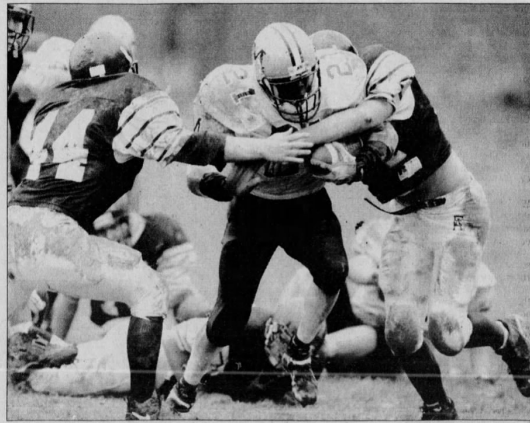
Certainly, Green hopes Pellegrini will stay.

He's one of the reasons Green came out of the city to play at Malvern Prep, which is ranked fourth in the Mainline-DeLco area and second in Chester County by The Inquirer.

"Coach Gamp kept us in this thing the whole year," Green said. "He coaches until the final tick goes off."
